## **GROTON HEIGHTS SCHOOL REDEVELOPMENT**

A Request for Proposals (RFP) for the Groton Heights School redevelopment project was issued on June 28<sup>th</sup>. The Town of Groton is soliciting proposals from qualified and experienced development teams that best serve Groton's economic and community development interests. The site, located at 244 Monument Street, is owned by the Town of Groton. The Groton Heights building is 27,185 square feet and sits on 2.00 +/- acres. Groton has actively marketed the project. The primary objective is the planned and timely redevelopment of this property in a way that maximizes financial and community benefits. This 1912 property is unique given its proximity to the Fort Griswold Monument and location overlooking the Thames River. The Town desires for the property to realize its highest and best use and to contribute to Groton's tax base.

## MONTHLY MANAGEMENT REPORT

### Water Pollution Control Division (June)

- The Division treated 95.5 million gallons of waste for the month.
- The Division continues to perform better than the permit requires for Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Biochemical Oxygen Demand (BOD), and other key performance indicators.
- Staff performed 114 Call Before You Dig mark outs including four emergency calls during the month.
- The collection team cleaned/inspected 1,717 feet of collection system lines for the month of June.
- Staff investigated a number of sewer billing questions and identified several missing sewer accounts.
- Chris Lund conducted a talk on Public Outreach efforts at the New England Water Environment Association (NEWEA) spring meeting in Newport, Rhode Island.
- Staff hosted a tour of approximately 100 students from Charles Barnum Elementary school on June 4<sup>th</sup>.
