Groton Offers Assistance to Veterans

Connecticut law (PA 13-34) requires that all CT Cities and Towns have a local Veterans' Advisory Committee, a Veterans' Service Officer <u>or</u> a Veterans' Service Contact Person. In Groton, the Veteran's Service Contact Person is Marge Fondulas, Director of Human Services. The Human Services Department has expanded its resource information for veterans and has established links to regional, State and Federal resources for veterans. AT GROTON HUMAN SERVICES, VETERANS MAY ACCESS STATE OR FEDERAL WEBSITES FOR INFORMATION, APPLICATION FORMS, ETC. Veterans in need of emergency food or utility and/or rent assistance are screened for eligibility by department social workers and assisted in accordance with established program criteria.

PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR VETERANS

CT law provides for a <u>\$1500 assessment exemption (for real property or automobiles)</u> for veterans who are honorably discharged after actively serving at least 90 days during a period of conflict.

An original or certified copy of your honorable discharge (DD214) must be filed in Groton Land Records prior to October 1. Veterans who maintain a VA disability rating of at least 10% are entitled to an increased exemption, depending upon the disability rating and income level. <u>Applications must be filed every two years with the Assessor's Office between Feb. 1 and Oct. 1. Proof of income for the previous calendar year is required.</u> For more info, contact the Groton Assessor at 860-441-6660.

Resources for Seniors, Disabled Persons and Others

Tax Relief Program for Elderly and **Totally Disabled** Renters

Starting in May, social workers in the Human Services Dept take

applications for Groton residents who wish to participate in the State-sponsored Tax Relief Program for Elderly and Totally Disabled Renters, (aka "Renters' Rebate.") The social workers coordinate with the Resident Managers at the local complexes for senior or disabled residents to take applications for the program. The social workers also connect with renters living in mobile homes and other local rental properties to make sure any renter who is eligible for the rebate applies in a timely manner. Information regarding eligibility and program dates is posted on the Town and HS Dept. web pages and also on GMTV-2's Bulletin Board.

THE PROGRAM IS ADMINISTERED AT THE STATE LEVEL BY THE OFFICE OF POLICY AND MANAGE-MENT (OPM), WHICH ISSUES THE REBATE CHECKS **DIRECTLY TO RESIDENTS.**

- The 2024 program will be available to local \rightarrow residents who are 65 yrs or older as of 12/31/23 OR residents age 18 or older who have been determined by the Social Security Administration to be totally and permanently disabled as of 12/31/23.
- Program applicants must have paid rent in CT \rightarrow for a partial or full calendar year in 2023.
- The income limit for single individuals is \rightarrow \$40,300; for married couples, \$49,100.
- Rebates usually range from a max of \$700 for _**→** single individuals to \$900 for married couples.
- Documents needed to apply include: \rightarrow
 - Copy of 2023 Income Tax (if filed) •
 - Proof of all rent paid in 2023 (rent receipts of letter)
 - Proof of all utility bills paid in 2023
 - Proof of all income for 2023 (Examples: Wages, SSA-1099, Pensions, Interest, etc.)

Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program



Each year in early to mid-summer, Groton Human Services participates in the CT Dept. of Agriculture Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program. In the past, coupon books were made available to eligible State residents, each containing six (6) three dollar (\$3) vouchers. A new system is now in place which provides benefit cards to eligible program participants. There are over 100 participating CT Farmers' Markets operating seasonally from June through October throughout the state. One benefit card, per person, is available per season to individuals meeting State Dept of Agriculture eligibility criteria:

- Recipients must be at least 60 years old, OR, if under 60 yrs of age, permanently disabled and living in subsidized senior and disabled housing .
- Maximum household income cannot exceed 185% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines: \$26,973 for single individuals and \$36,482 for married couples.
- Proof of current income and a photo ID are required.

REDUCED FEE VETERINARY CARE AVAILABLE

Companion Animal Hospital in Groton offers reduced fee vet services to eligible local households. Eligibility for these services is determined by Groton Human Services. Please call 860-441-6760 for more information.

The State of CT Dept of Agriculture Animal Population Control Program periodically offers VOUCHERS to lowincome households for pet sterilization services. The vouchers provide a onetime benefit of \$50 for a male cat, \$70 for a female cat, \$100 for a male dog and \$120 for a female dog. Included in this program are two presurgical pet vaccinations. Applications are available at Groton Human Services. This program is available to households on SNAP, Husky, SAGA, TFA or ST Supplement.
